Ladies Competition Games

Played at North Ryde

Stroke

The number of strokes taken on each hole is entered on the score card, or in the App. All players must hole out on each hole *. The player with the lowest score (scratch/gross or nett, depending on the competition) is the winner.

The total score is added up (this is the gross) and the handicap is subtracted to get the Nett score.

***Exception:** Where maximum score is permitted – **Maximum score = double par + 2)**

(e.g. Maximum score on Par 5 = 12 strokes, Par 4 = 10 strokes, Par 3 = 8 strokes).

Maximum score is permitted in all North Ryde stroke rounds **apart from the Club Championships and the North Ryde Salver.**

Stableford

Stableford is a form of stroke play where points are awarded on each hole depending on the players Target Score. (The Target Score for a hole = Par for hole + any Handicap Strokes). Handicap strokes for each hole are determined by the player's daily handicap and the index rating of the hole. The competition is won by the player with the most Stableford points.

(Example: On a Par 4 hole a player with a Daily Handicap of 36 would get 2 Handicap Strokes making the Target Score for that hole 6). If the player completes the hole in 6 strokes, then they score 2 points.

Scoring in Stableford

Hole Played in	Points
More than one over the target score	0
One over the target score	1
Achieving the Target Score	2
One less than the Target Score	3
Two less than the Target Score	4
Three less than the Target Score	5

To help Pace of Play players are encouraged to pick up their ball when their score will result in Zero points.

Par

Par is played using a similar system to Stableford with handicap strokes allocated to each hole. The score for each hole must be entered on the score card, or the App and the Par Score entered in the results column on the card.



If the nett score for the hole is equal to the Target score for the hole (2 points in Stableford) the result for the hole is "Square" and a is entered in the result column. If the nett score is lower than Target (3 points in Stableford) the result is a "Plus" and "+" is entered in the results column. If the nett score is greater than the Target for that hole then a "Minus" or "-" is entered into the results column.

At the end of the round the "pluses" and "minuses" are added up with the nett result being so many "Up", "Down" or "Square". The App automatically calculates the score.

Par Plus

Par Plus is played in the same way as a Par game with the only difference being that if the nett score for the hole is two less than the target score for the hole (4 points in Stableford) the result would be "++". Three less than the target score for the hole (5 points in Stableford) the result would be "+++". The App automatically calculates the score.

Ambrose

Played with teams of two or four players. Handicaps are $\frac{1}{4}$ of combined for two players and $\frac{1}{8}$ of combined for teams of 4.

- All players in the team hit off then the best tee shot is selected.
- Each player to have 8 Tee shots (teams of 2) or 4 Tee shots (teams of 4) – these must be shown on scorecard.
- The position of the ball selected **MUST** be marked, or left in place, all players then play from within one club length of the original ball (not nearer the hole), in the same type of lie, eg: fairway, rough, bunker or hazard.
- The ball may be dropped or placed in all situations.
- Place ball within 15cm on green

Foursomes

Foursomes (also known as Alternate Shots) is played as a stroke event where two players compete as a team **playing only one ball** with alternating shots. Players hit off on alternate tees and play alternate shots until the ball is holed. Penalty shots do not alter the order of play. Handicaps are $\frac{1}{2}$ of the combined handicaps. The team with the lowest score (scratch or nett – depending on the competition) are the winners

Canadian Foursomes

Both players hit off every tee. They then decide which ball they will play and take the other ball out of play. The player whose ball was not selected then hits the second shot with their partner's ball. Continue playing alternate shots with that ball until holed out. Handicap allowance is $\frac{3}{8}$ of combined handicaps.

Irish Team Stableford

Played in teams of four. The following scores to count:

- For the first 6 holes (1-6) the best stableford score
- For the next 6 holes (7-12) the best 2 scores to count
- For the last 6 holes (13-18) the best 3 scores to count.

The team with the most points is the winner.



Four Person Waltz Stableford

Played in teams of four. The team with the most points is the winner.

- For the first hole best stableford score
- For the second hole best 2 scores
- For the third hole best 3 scores
- This pattern (1 score, 2 scores, 3 scores) continues (i.e. Holes 1,4,7,10,13,16 (one score), Holes 2,5, 8,11,14,17 (two scores) and Holes 3,6,9,12,15,18 (three scores)).

Aggregate Stableford

- Each player is to record their individual stableford scores.
- The computer will add the two players' 'stableford points' together to get the "Aggregate Stableford Points" for that hole.
- Both Stableford scores to count.
